A) NAME OF THE CITY

Meaning 'Land of the Gazelle' in Arabic, Abu Dhabi was founded when a young antelope led a wandering tribe to fresh water, on an island with no more than 300 palm ('barasti') huts, a few coral buildings and the Ruler's fort. Until the 1960s, Abu Dhabi was a small settlement of modest houses, some of them without electricity, before the shape and the structure of the city changed dramatically thanks to the oil business.

Abu Dhabi is located in the far west and southwest part of the United Arab Emirates along the southern coast of the Arabian Gulf. It is the largest of the seven emirates which make up the United Arab Emirates. It is also home to the UAE capital – Abu Dhabi City.

While being one of the world's largest producers of oil, Abu Dhabi has actively attempted to diversify its economy in recent years through investments in financial services and tourism.

Having undergone rapid growth since the 1980s, it is now regarded as one of the most modern cities in the world. Abu Dhabi is home to important financial institutions such as the Abu Dhabi Securities Exchange, the Central Bank of the United Arab Emirates and the corporate headquarters of numerous multinational corporations.

The destination is benefitting from increasing air links with new markets – Latin America, for instance, now being opened up. The emirate is home to multi-award-winning Etihad Airways, the UAE's national carrier and Abu Dhabi International Airport is served by numerous regional and international carriers including flagship airlines such as British Airways, KLM, Air France, Alitalia and Lufthansa.





The destination's top four hotel producers are: the Domestic/GCC (high potential market); UK (traditional market); India (emerging market) and Germany (traditional market). Significant emerging markets are Brazil and Australia (stop-over traffic) and Russia (currently impacted by limited air links and the falling value of the rouble) and China (benefitting from enhanced air links).

The city's most important landmark is the Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan al Nahyan Mosque, one of the most amazing pieces of architecture in the United Arab Emirates and one of the most beautiful mosques in the world.

There are many more authentic places to find like the very popular Iranian souk, a network of small shops selling items from handmade rugs to traditionally designed jewellery. As a fascinating contrast, Abu Dhabi is also home to one of the region's biggest shopping malls, the Marina Mall, which houses approximately 270 stores, from high-street to high-end fashion.

An exciting experience with fun and action for all ages is the Abu Dhabi Ferrari World, the world's first Ferrari theme park and the biggest of its kind. The park tells the history of the legendary Italian car company through more than 20 breath-taking and educational rides and attractions, including the world's fastest roller coaster with a maximum speed of 240 km/h, interactive shopping and authentic Italian dining experiences. Thrill-seekers will also enjoy the futuristic Yas Island waterpark with its 43 rides and slides, while those who prefer a more cerebral emphasis to their visit can enjoy the Saadiyat Cultural District, home to museums like the Louvre or the Guggenheim.





Discover The World Of Falconry

Falconry is one of Arabia's ancient sports and it is an integral part of a deeply rooted heritage dating back hundreds of years. This sport, known locally as 'sniping', represents an important part of the civilization and heritage of Abu Dhabi, which is celebrated for its conservationist efforts. Guests can tour the Abu Dhabi Falcon Hospital, established in 1999 as the world's first public institution providing comprehensive veterinary healthcare services exclusively for falcons. The world-renowned facility gives visitors an unforgettable insight into the fascinating world of falcons and falconry.

Watch Camel Racing At Al Wathba Racetrack

Camel racing is one of Abu Dhabi's most popular sports and tourist attractions. The races are a highlight for sports enthusiasts during winter, and are usually held on Thursday and Friday mornings.

Fly over Abu Dhabi in a private helicopter

This is an unparalleled experience that spans the Corniche and neighboring islands. Falcon Aviation Services will fly you in the lap of luxury to an alternative view of the emirate.

Visit The Fish Market

Follow your nose for a fish frenzy at Abu Dhabi Dhow Wharf and Fish Market. Boats unload their catch day and night and the air rings with the shouts of market traders, fisher-men and customers shopping for their supper. You can glimpse the real old Abu Dhabi here. Visitors can buy fish straight from the dhow fishermen, get it cleaned there and then on the spot, and even have it charcoal grilled in extremely hot ovens.



Tour The Camel Market

The Al Ain Camel Market is famous throughout the country and attracts breeders and buyers from all over the UAE. It has recently been transferred to a new site on the Mezyad Road. The camels are kept in a series of fenced paddocks according to their intended use. Young camels, reared for meat, are separated from older animals kept for breeding and milk. The lively, bustling market provides an opportunity to hear traders extolling the merits of their prized animals, discussing prices and negotiating sales. The close relationship developed over many centuries between Arabs and their camels has given these extraordinary animals a special place in the UAE heritage.

Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque Tour

The Sheikh Zayed Grand mosque is one of the worlds largest mosques and is a truly international architectural masterpiece. It is home to the worlds largest hand-made carpet, designed by Iranian artist Ali Khaliqi and woven by more than 200 workers who spent 12 months completing the spectacular piece of art in 28 different colors. The Mosque is a magnificent addition to Islamic architectural splendor and is a landmark in the United Arab Emirates and the whole region. The main prayer hall, under three large domes, can accommodate over 6,000 worshippers and the whole mosque can accommodate 40,000 worshippers. There are complimentary guided tours of the mosque with trained Emirati guides every day. The tours are an excellent platform for cultural and religious understanding.

Safari into The Empty Quarter's Sounds and Colours of Silence

For the most spectacular desert experience, there is nothing like a safari to the Liwa region in the south of the emirate where sand dunes are as high as sky-scrapers. Starting from the edge, you will drive through the golden dunes of the Rub Al Khali (Empty Quarter), the largest desert of the region, and stay overnight at the Liwa Hotel or stunning Qasr Al Sarab (Mirage Palace), surrounded by some of the worlds highest sand dunes and overlooking a breathtaking oasis.

ZAYED SPORTS CITY



The flexibility of the stadium's multi-purpose design has paved the way for significant local and international events to take place at the venue. Zayed Sports City Stadium has a storied history that includes events of all shapes and sizes. You can even be a part of its legacy by booking for a football match between friends!



Abu Dhabi Corniche is a beachfront boulevard occasionally used for bicycle races, marathons and running for fitness purposes and other beach sports.

Abu Dhabi Golf Club offers one of the most luxurious golf resort experiences within the Middle East, in full management with the renowned worldwide golf resort management organizations of excellence, Troon Golf. Fifteen minutes from the city centre and just ten minutes from Abu Dhabi International Airport, Abu Dhabi Golf Club is perfectly located for domestic and international guests.

Al Ain Equestrian Club was opened for riders in September 2007 with the vision to provide excellent horsemanship and equestrian skills in a safe and fun environment with quality instruction.

From the beginner to the expert, horse riding at the AESGC offers a new level of instruction, experience and enjoyment. Since 2010, the AESGC Equestrian Club has hosted many Local and International show jumping competitions; the biggest event the club has held was the prestigious President of the UAE Show Jumping Cup 2013. By January 2014, the AESGC became the fifth race-course in the UAE to hold race meetings with their team.

Al Nahyan Stadium is a multi-purpose stadium. It is currently used mostly for football matches and is the home ground of Al Wahda. The stadium holds 12,000 people and was built in 1995. It hosted group games of the 2003 FIFA World Youth Championship and is momentarily being upgraded in perpatration for the 2019 AFC Asian Cup.

Mohammed Bin Zayed Stadium is a multi-purpose stadium named after the current Crown Prince HH General Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan.

It was opened at 1979/1980 and under the name of Al Jazira Stadium, renovated during 2006 / 2009 and named as Mohamed bin Zayed Stadium, the surface is grass and the current capacity is 42.056 seats.

It is famous for its unique architect design and its multiple fully air-conditioned platforms and stages, and the excellent and smart design of the seats, allowing the audience to watch the matches and events from a very close range.

KHALIFA BIN ZAYED STADIUM (KBZ STADIUM)

Inaugurated in 1971, Khalifa bin Zayed Stadium (KBZS) is one of the key premises for Al Ain Sports and Cultural Club. KBZS is the main headquarters that hosts all training sessions of the first team of Al Ain Football Club and Sports Games. Since its inauguration, it has hosted a number of regional and international tournaments.

In 2002, the Stadium has undergone series of renovations, resulting in an all new state-of-the-art architectural design becoming a landmark of modern sports development in the UAE. The new stadium, which was furnished with new seats to accommodate 12,000 spectators, comprises a main lounge, ballrooms, office space, changing rooms, clinic and physical therapy unit.





Tahnoon Bin Mohammad Stadium (TBM Stadium) is a multi-purpose stadium in Al Ain, United Arab Emirates. It is currently used mostly for football matches and is one of the home grounds of Al Ain Club. The stadium holds approximately 15,000 people and was opened on 21 August 1987. This stadium played host to two AFC Champions League final matches one in 2003 and the other in 2005. In 30/5/2006 the Ittihad and Al Khaleej newspapers of the UAE stated that a new world class stadium would be built in the city of Al Ain and would be completed within the next five years.

Al Forsan International Sports Resort is located right at the heart of Khalifa City, the blossoming hub of the new Abu Dhabi 2030 Plan. The Resort is just a 10-minute drive from the Abu Dhabi International Airport and the Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Centre.

Al Forsan International Sports Resort is the first in the Middle East to introduce the water cable park system. It is a huge overhead cable erected around the banks of the purpose-built 'pro' and 'beginner' lakes. The cable travels between 29 to 38kph (depending on the level of experience), pulling participants around the lake on their chosen board or ski.

From indoor and outdoor training areas to the fully floodlit world-class facilities, the Equestrian Academy at Al Forsan has been designed to meet international standards and create the perfect environment for those who love horses. Al Forsan is a BHS approved Centre like no other in the UAE. Students of all ages and skill levels are trained in the Equestrian Academy In a wide range of disciplines.

The Motor Sports Centre is geared up to cater for both competitive and non-competitive track events. The 1.2km CIK approved professional circuit is designed and built to the highest and most modern criteria, offering a challenging and exhilarating experience, with the most advanced safety features on any karting circuit in the world.

Al Wathba is a cycling track 40 minutes by car from the UAE Capital and next to the camel racing track. Five different loops (8km, 16km, 20km, 22km and 30km), one bar, a dedicated bike shop and a changing room with lockers and showers complete the offer of this track which is surrounded by the desert and is equipped with a lighting system for cycling at night.

EMIRATES PALACE

Within 100 hectares of luscious gardens and lawns, and along 1.3 km of pristine beach, enjoy a plethora of activities for all athletic levels and ages. The Hazza bin Zayed Stadium is a multi-purpose stadium. It is the home stadium of Al Ain FC of the UAE Pro-League. The stadium holds 22,717 spectators and opened in 2014. The 45,000sqm Hazza bin Zayed stadium is split over seven levels, and is one of the most modern sporting venues in the Middle East. It is one of the most sophisticated sports venues in the region.

SAADIYAT BEACH GOLF CLUB

This Gary Player design championship course was designed to be simultaneously a challenging and rewarding experience that caters to all types of players, starting at 5,290 yards to 7,806 yards – the latter believed to be among the most demanding environments for the world's leading tour players.

However, the golf club is not just about its superb putting green. It is also a wonderful venue for a wide range of events from children's parties to weddings, and everything in between. Furthermore, with a flexible approach to event planning, those seeking to mix business with pleasure can choose to partake in a series of golf training courses in the club's state-of-the-art academy, where all facets of the game can be worked on with highly skilled instructors.

Zayed Cricket Stadium was built in 2005 and its inaugural international match was staged between India and Pakistan in April 2006 and was attended by 20,000 enthusiastic fans. With Abu Dhabi Sports Council's support, Abu Dhabi Cricket operates under the patronage of His Excellency Sheikh Nahyan Bin Mubarak Al Nahyan. The Club is ushering in an exciting new era of cricket in Abu Dhabi with significant investment in facilities and operational upgrades. The Stadium has also been used by several international associations as a winter training ground, most notably by the England Cricket Board.

Recent investments to develop the facility will ensure that the Stadium will be known for more than cricket. Indeed, ADC will be home to a range of coaching academies, clubs, groups and schools for football, touch rugby, tennis, netball, basketball, squash and much more. For the First time ever during a FIFA competition, a turf farm has been developed in ADC in order to re-turf ZSC stadium before the FIFA CWC UAE 2018.

Yas Links Abu Dhabi Golf Club has combined a competitive spirit and honorable history with some of the finest facilities in the region to produce a truly remarkable club.



Yas Marina Circuit is considered one of the most technologically-advanced Formula 1® circuits in the world and a home for motorsports in the Middle East. Yas Marina Circuit was unveiled on 30th October 2009 with the final race of the Formula 1® World Championship – the inaugural FORMULA 1 ETIHAD AIRWAYS ABU DHABI GRAND PRIX – to a crowd around 60,000 spectators.

The versatile facility opened its doors to the world after two years of intensive planning and construction involving 14,000 staff and 35 million construction man-hours. The United Arab Emirates was eager to take in the beautiful landscaping and traditional Arabic hospitality alongside sensational on-track action. Yas Marina Circuit encourages the growth of sporting culture in the UAE and prides itself on being the centre for motorsports excellence in the Middle East.

Abu Dhabi Ladies Club is the perfect place offering women all the facilities of comfort and relaxation. A place where any female can feel completely at home in public the club stride to provide a multicultural environment.

Abu Dhabi Ladies Club is the first of its kind in Abu Dhabi when it comes to a full option facility for women with; Gym, Group Exercise Classes, Kids Gym, Indoor & Outdoor Swimming Pool, Café, Restaurant, Library, Tennis, Squash, Cross Fit, Spa, Beauty Salon and much more coming up.

Al Ain Ladies Club is one of the main development projects in Abu Dhabi emirate as it shall cater for women's sportive needs in Al Ain City. The Club shall allow the opportunity for all women's segments in Al Ain City to practice various sporting activities, access other social, recreational and entertainment services.

Based on its objectives, this new project will no doubt motivate and encourage all targeted segments in Al Ain City to resort to using sport exercises as a lifestyle.

Al Wathba Cycle is a cycling track 40 minutes by car from the UAE Capital and next to the camel racing track. Five different loops (8km, 16km, 20km, 22km and 30km), one bar, a dedicated bike shop and a changing room with lockers and showers complete the offer of this track which is surrounded by the desert and is equipped with a lighting system for cycling at night.

NYUAD Sports Facilities offer a full complement of indoor and outdoor facilities to host a sporting event or large tournament.

Amongst the Indoor Facilities there are a 200-meter running track, 8 lanes x 50 meter swimming pool, public viewing gallery, a gym with full range of equipment, a dance studio with ballet barre and ladies-only facilities.

The Outdoor areas are fully lit for nighttime use with a 400-meter running track, full size, natural turf pitches for multiple sports, four tennis courts and two multi-purpose courts.

Al Hudayriat is an island development with multiple facilities.

Among the attractions are an undisturbed, 600-metre beach, running and cycling tracks (5 and 10 km), water sports, a bouncy castle and a children's playground. It is part of a new city development that will include housing for Emiratis and commercial attractions, advancing Abu Dhabi with cutting-edge ideas that will be put into action over the next 20 years.

Set to Olympics-size standards, the island is also designed to host a world series of triathlons – "it's a beautiful hub for that," said an official from the council, who preferred not to be named.

Other athletic attractions include five football fields, four basketball courts, four volleyball and four beach football courts.





Abu Dhabi Equestrian Besides being the home of horse racing in the capital, the club has one of the most efficient and successful riding schools in the area, with instructors at all levels, ready to teach the principles and practices of horsemanship.

Abu Dhabi Country Club is the first and most exclusive health & fitness club of its kind in the UAE capital. Established in 1999 by the Government of Abu Dhabi, the Health & Fitness Club enlarged its scope of operations to focus more on family activities and integrate even more into the social fabric of Abu Dhabi.

It is also home to the Spacewalk; the only indoor sky-diving facility in the capital. For team sports, ADCC has a new multi-purpose court which can accommodate football, basketball, volleyball, handball and tennis with spectator seating. For outdoors, ADCC hosts tennis courts, a swimming pool (there's an indoor one too) and football fields.

For youngsters, there are dance classes in ballet, belly dancing, hip hop and various other genres (according to availability) as well as school sports training.

They also provide space for functions, indoor and outdoor, where companies can conduct team-building events which include the use of some of ADCC's sporting facilities.

The Armed Forces Officers Club & Hotel is not just a hotel; it also has a surprising range of activities available to the public. Not only do they host paintball games on their sprawling fields, there are also grounds to accommodate volleyball and football.

For those more inclined to stay indoors, there is also an Olympic-size swimming pool, squash courts, table tennis, bowling, basketball courts and pool, snooker and billiards tables. It wouldn't be an officers' club without its two Olympic-standard shooting galleries.

B) PLANNED SPORTING FACILITIES

Yas Arena, an arena with a capacity of 18,000 seats will be used to host events in a temperature controlled environment and is located on Yas Island, Abu Dhabi, UAE. Abu Dhabi events company Flash Entertainment will host gigs and sports events inside the Yas Arena and it has been designed in a way it can host a variety of events, from tennis tournaments to wrestling matches and more. Work already started on 17 December 2017 and is expected to be completed by November 2019.

Swimming Complex at Mohamed Bin Zayed City

In November 2016 it was announced that the Emirate of Abu Dhabi would host the 2019 Special Olympics World Games. In the light of this event, Abu Dhabi Sports Council and Zayed Higher Organization are aiming at building new integrated sports facilities to host this swimming competition of the 2019 Special Olympics World Games, and to be utilized after the Olympics as part of community facilities.

C) MUNICIPAL EXPENSES FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF SPORT FACILITIES

In October 2015, the UAE Cabinet approved a federal budget of AED 48.5 billion for the year 2016. More than 50 per cent of this was set aside for health, education and social development services collectively. Social development services alone received 15.4 per cent of the budget amounting AED 7.5 billion. The Government supports social development services through public funds to support sports clubs and other priorities such as families with children, maternal and child welfare, disabled persons and youth.

E) GOVERNMENT AUTHORITIES RESPONSIBLE FOR SPORTS

General Authorities for Sports (YSA) is the federal authority responsible for the development of sports sector in accordance to Federal Decree-Law No. 7 of 2008.

It was known before as the Ministry of Youth and Sports (MoYS). It aims to play a leading role in providing a positive attractive environment that enables youth to develop physical and mental abilities, utilize free time, improve creative skills, deepen national identity principles, install loyalty, belonging and voluntary work sense. YSA works also on developing competitive, recreational and traditional sports, providing a healthy environment to carry them out and making it possible to upgrade results at national and international levels. Its role includes implementing the Government's policy on the sports sector, spreading the culture of sports as a way of life to reduce illnesses and promote fitness, representing the best talent at regional and international sports events and taking tangible measures to facilitate the participation of women and people with special needs in sports events. The authority achieves these by holding events and competitions. It is supported by the Abu Dhabi Sports Council ADSC.



A) DETAILED LIST OF SPORT INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITIES

Private Sport Facilities

For the private sport facilities, please note that ADSC has some certain regulations in terms of organizing the technical, administrative, and safety measures at private facilities. Private facilities are directed to register and to rehabilitate their professional instructors through UAE Reps.


About agreements with Private Facilities in this respect, ADSC has no such agreements with any private facilities, as those register their multinational members as per their respective offers, and without any intervention from ADSC.

As for the management of private commercial sports clubs, it is done through the owner of the club where he develops the operational and financial plan for the club. The commercial markets in the Emirate of Abu Dhabi are open according to the investor's vision. The role of government agencies is limited to taking into account the requirements of the administrative, technical, security and safety. To determine the number of beneficiaries or the financial value to benefit from the services provided.

Public Sports Facilities

Some public sports facilities that have been found to achieve a community goal and to encourage the sport culture among members of society in order to combat obesity and diseases resulting from non-exercise. In addition to that, some are managed by specialized professional ways according to the type of sports activity in order to seek the achievement of local or international tournaments. The player's selection process is through technical, health and sports standards according to the type of sports activity in the facility, taking into account the requirements and laws established to regulate sports activity locally through the Abu Dhabi Sports Council and internationally through the international representative of the activity.





B) PROCEDURES: AGREEMENTS, SPORT CARD, PUBLIC TRANSPORT

In private clubs: Licensing is being issued by the competent authority to issue licenses for private commercial clubs which is the Department of Economic Development in coordination with the Abu Dhabi Sports Council to develop the administrative, technical sports requirements, security and safety requirements of the establishment.

The trainers are licensed through coordination between the Abu Dhabi Sports Council and REBS UAE to register professional trainers.

In public clubs:

- Public clubs with profitable objectives are licensed through the Department of Economic Development and these clubs are committed to the requirements and standards set by them.
- Public clubs with non-profit goals set the procedures and requirements for sports activity and are managed according to annual plans that serve the strategic objectives of these clubs.

With regard to low-priced cards, ticket prices are calculated according to the different segments of the society by listing them according to different categories starting with insignificant prices and other prices with higher privileges and services.

UAE provides a public transport network that serves all facilities, including sport facilities, and provides special parking for the masses and members of the clubs according to capacity studies of the sports facility to the public.



Abu Dhabi Transport Mobility Management Plan

Huge Investment in sporting activities is a fundamental component of the branding strategy of Abu-Dhabi not only to increase their visitor numbers but also to position the Emirate as an international sports destination. Although it takes a long time for events to become firmly associated with a particular destination and it is still early days for Abu Dhabi, the portfolio of events is growing year on year as new venues worldwide destination reputation together with benefits such as increasing number of visitors, employment and community engagement is beginning to realized. All this comes along with significant challenges in the increase and organization of private and public transportation.

The overarching Transport Mobility Management (TMM) Strategy is composed of a number of sub-strategies that are aimed at specific target groups. Segmentation and target group specific actions and Transport Mobility Management measures are crucial in achieving the desired outcomes. Each sub-strategy focuses on TMM plans for the relevant target groups as well as a number of stand-alone initiatives.

In order to provide a smooth and efficient transportation system for visitors and event organizers the Abu Dhabi Transport Mobility Management Plan (TMM) mainly aims to:

- Encourage a change of attitude and behaviour towards greater use of sustainable modes of transport
- Improve access to public transport for all people and organisations by strengthening the conditions for sustainable modes of transport
- Satisfy mobility needs via a more efficient and integrated use of existing and planned transport and land-use infrastructure
- Reduce traffic growth and congestion by achieving a mode shift from private motorised vehicle trips to a more efficient and sustainable mode of transport
- Create an efficient multimodal public transport network that will facilitate the interconnection and inter-operability of associated transport networks



The strategy seeks to increase choice of transportation modes and implement sustainable travel options. It uses a mix of policies, education, information and infrastructure to address Abu Dhabi's travel needs in a way that reduces the number of cars on the roads at any given point of time, thus reducing congestion.

The Transportation Mobility Management Strategy is a significant building block in helping Abu Dhabi fulfil its growth potential. It offers organisations and businesses the unique opportunity to play a pivotal role in having their own mobility management plan developed and executed.

B) VOLUNTEERS

Anti Doping Measures

ICDADS 2018: The 20th International Conference on Doping and Anti-Doping Studies ICDADS is held in the UAE on November 19th and 20th, 2018.

The 20th International Conference on Doping and Anti-Doping Studies aims to bring together leading academic scientists, researchers and research scholars to exchange and share their experiences and research results on all aspects of Doping and Anti-Doping Studies.

It also provides a premier interdisciplinary platform for researchers, practitioners and educators to present and discuss the most recent innovations, trends, and concerns as well as practical challenges encountered and solutions adopted in the fields of Doping and Anti-Doping Studies.

ICDADS 2018 has teamed up with the Special Journal Issue on Doping and Anti-Doping Studies. A number of selected high-impact full text papers will also be considered for the special journal issues.



All submitted papers will have the opportunity to be considered for this Special Journal Issue. The paper selection will be carried out during the peer review process as well as at the conference presentation stage. Submitted papers must not be under consideration by any other journal or publication. The final decision for paper selection will be made based on peer review reports by the Guest Editors and the Editor-in-Chief jointly.

The general secretary of the UAE National Anti-Doping Committee (Nado) has reiterated that that implementing the world anti-doping code in the UAE is progressing quickly.

Established in 2004 along with the launch of the World Anti-Doping Agency (Wada) in Athens, Nado has been successfully pursuing the key objectives laid down by Wada that includes education and monitoring of the Wada code, among others.

To date, Nado has carried out close to 2,500 tests in and out of competition, with detailed figures being made available of the tests done here since 2008. From the 2,500-odd tests done so far just 27 have tested positive.

Since 2004 Wada has been harmonising rules and regulations governing anti-doping across all sports and countries, and following an extensive consultation period, revisions to the anti-doping code were adopted in November 2007. These revisions that included a number of measures strengthening the global fight against doping in sport took effect from January 2009.

In 2013, further amendments to the code were approved, the most important one being the doubling of the sanctions against drug cheats from the existing two years to four. The updated code has come into place in 2015.

One of the main aspects in the UAE's low figures in positive cases has been the continuous education of its sportspersons by Nado.

C) RETURN OF THE INVESTMENT FROM THE USE OF CITIZEN INSTALLATIONS

Sport is hugely important to our society, our culture and our economy. Abu Dhabi Sports Council's role is to manage the sport ecosystem in terms of all sports clubs and federations, major international events and local community events.

The Formula 1 Etihad Airways Abu Dhabi Grand Prix, FIFA Club World Cup UAE and the Abu Dhabi HSBC Championship - in addition to many others - have all played an important role to promote Abu Dhabi as a global capital for sport, whilst having a significant impact on our economy.

Whilst our international events help promote Abu Dhabi to a global audience, they also inspire the next generation of our community to play sport and lead a healthier life. They also develop our own athletes whose success will be important as role models in our society.

The push to become a sports tourism destination has seen Abu Dhabi invest heavily in facilities for a wide range of sports, including motor racing, yachting and water sports, cricket, football, tennis, basketball, cycling and golf.

In additional to facilitating year-round sports for both professional and recreational enthusiasts, Abu Dhabi's mild and usually dry winters allow the country to host several sporting events during the off-seasons in Europe, North America and Asia.

According to data issued by the Abu Dhabi Tourism & Culture Authority (TCA Abu Dhabi), just over 4.1m visitors stayed at hotels in the emirate over the course of 2015, an 18% year-on-year increase.



Industry stakeholders will be looking to underscore the value of sponsorship of Abu Dhabi-based events. A recent poll conducted by research firm YouGov found that Abu Dhabi-based airline Etihad Airways was the second most identifiable brand in the UAE. A key factor in raising Etihad Airways's brand recognition was its sponsorship of high-profile sporting events and teams, both at home and abroad.

Etihad Airways will likely see its reach extend even further, with the airline renewing its sponsorship of the Abu Dhabi HSBC Golf Championship through to 2020. The carrier also remains the banner sponsor for the F1 Etihad Airways Abu Dhabi Grand Prix and the main club partner for the Manchester City Football Club.

Media coverage of sporting events in Abu Dhabi generate \$173.2m worth of value. Sport continues to be a key driver for economic growth in Abu Dhabi with key sporting events generating \$545.5m into the economy.

Measurement of the impact of sport in the community is vital, particularly as mass participation sport is a particular area of growth in the sponsorship industry.

The sports sponsorship industry in the UAE has been generally stable, with some cautious optimism for future growth following a period of prudency. The development of sports sponsorship education, the need for sponsorship activation innovation and understanding of brands' needs through sponsorship are all key learning for growth of the industry in the UAE.



ECONOMIC IMPACT OF SPORTS EVENTS IN ABU DHABI

Abu Dhabi's leading sport events are vital for the economy. In 2017, the value they generated was US\$545.5m.







A) SPECIAL HEALTH CARE PROGRAMS

The Sports Medicine Center was established in 2004 to provide necessary health and medical care to members of youth and sports, associations.

State-of-the-art scientific means in the field of sports medicine are a basic requirement and a main supplemental element to meet the needs of the sports and youth sector in the UAE. It provides all types of medical and physical therapy and rehab treatment.

The Center consists of several departments such as nursing, physical metering, anthropology, examination, diagnosis, physiotherapy, rehabilitation, relaxation, recovery, health awareness, statistics and research and laboratory. Objectives of the Sports Medicine Center are:

- To lay down adequate plans and programs to spread health awareness among community members in general, and young people in particular.
- To provide necessary consultations and assistance to the medical units of the sports clubs in the UAE.
- To coordinate with similar GCC, Arab and international medical centers to make use of the research, studies and developments in specialized hospitals inside and outside the UAE.
- To rehab injured by adequate means.
- To provide companion specialists to our products in the sports camps, championships and tournaments inside and outside the UAE.
- To conduct research and studies which improve sports operation. Such research and studies to cover different fields of training, means of improvement, feedback and modern means of physiotherapy.



- To coordinate with sports federations in the UAE in respect to the provision
 of healthcare and treatment to the players of national teams inside and outside the UAE.
- To hold courses and conferences in the fields of sports medicine in particular and health awareness in general.
- To issue specialized magazines and circulars in the field of sports medicine and health awareness and encourage the scholars in this field.

B) PRACTICE OPPORTUNITIES ACCORDING TO AGE GROUPS

In football the ultimate goal is to produce and promote a steady stream of Emirati talent that can progress through the ranks of international sports. The UAE women's football team moved into the top 100 in the FIFA World rankings to reach No 73; the highest rated team from the Arabian Gulf, and second highest Arab team behind Jordan.

Meanwhile, the next generation is already being prepared for the future with the UAE taking part in the Under 14 West Asia.

The FA has thrown its support and resources behind age-group national teams and this is just one model which is showcasing the many opportunities given in Abu Dhabi for participants in sports.

The number of rugby clubs introducing mini & junior rugby grows, showing an increase in the interest from grass roots level. Starting from the age of 5-19, young children, both girls and boys, can learn the basics of playing rugby.

Mini and junior rugby players are usually introduced to the sport by playing touch (tag) rugby, which is a non-contact version of the sport.



Many schools across the Gulf also include rugby as part of their sports curriculum. Gradually as the children become used to the rules of touch rugby, they're introduced to the physical side – mastering the tackling game! Usually from the age of 10+ the youth players will play full contact rugby up to the age of 17 or 18, when they will be looking to make their way into the men's senior rugby teams.

These are two examples to showcase that in Abu Dhabi all federations, clubs and many high schools and universities are offering specific programs for indoor and outdoor sport activities from kids, junior up the veteran and senior level to make sure sports can be played at all age levels and all performance levels.

C) SPORT COURSES FOR SPECIAL INTEREST GROUPS

A national strategy for empowering people with disabilities was launched by Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid.

The six-part policy announced by the Vice President and Ruler of Dubai involves health and rehabilitation, education, employment, mobility, social protection, family empowerment and public life and sports.

Sheikh Mohammed said the National Policy for Empowering People with Disabilities is aimed at creating an inclusive society for those with special needs and their families.

As part of a 'buddy' programme, students with disabilities are moving out of their comfort zone and leaving the familiar settings of their centre for a main-stream school campus where they pair up with non-special needs students in extracurricular activities to encourage learning and inclusion.



Apart from the races and sports planned, it gives some children an opportunity to reach past personal barriers, develop new skills and forge friendships. The social, emotional and physical benefits of sport are what drive many of us to lace up our trainers and hit the gym, road, trail or court – and the same positives apply to those less physically able.

Getting children with special needs involved in sport and engendering a more inclusive environment, is being championed by individuals, government entities, education providers and clubs across Abu Dhabi and the UAE.

D) INTEGRATION THROUGH SPORTS

In 2019 Abu Dhabi will see the biggest humanitarian sporting event with the Special Olympic World Games coming to the Emirati Capital, marking its first debut in the history of the MENA region. 7,000 participants from 170 countries will arrive for the event. The games will be held under the patronage of Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Deputy Supreme Commander of the UAE Armed Forces.

"We are blessed to be part of this great nation, guided by our wise leadership who constantly encourage us to promote the values of unity, compassion and inclusiveness amongst all members of society. It comes in line with our dedication to humanitarian action, driven by the vision of the late Sheikh Zayed Bin Sultan Al Nahyan for the UAE to play a leading role in spreading peace and harmony around the world", Mohammed Khalfan Matar Al Romaithi, said.

"Abu Dhabi hosting these international humanitarian events will undoubtedly empower both the sports sectors in the country and our talented athletes of determination, as it will showcase their talents and skills and highlight the importance of their seamless integration into society," he added.

Athletes will compete in sports including athletics, aquatics, badminton, basketball, bocce, bowling, cycling, equestrian, football, gymnastics, handball, powerlifting, table tennis, tennis, roller skating and, volleyball.

Organisers said 184 Emirati athletes with learning or cognitive disabilities are gearing up to compete across the 16 sports.

E) EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR COACHES AND INSTRUCTORS

Professional Sports Coaching Companies that focus on providing top quality, professional and experienced sports coaches across the United Arab Emirates are established in many cities, sport clubs and universities. There are several educational seminars for trainers and instructors in all clubs, federations and associations.

Out of many Fatima Bint Mubarak, Ladies Sports Academy, is committed to the vision of nurturing the future generations of Emirati champions, and in line with the mandate of empowering the UAE female athletes' community. Addressed primarily to elite and professional athletes and coaches, different seminars are envisaged to provide participants with the tools they need to succeed in their sports careers and their coaches need to optimize the training.



To be a better athlete does not necessarily mean you must train harder or longer. An athlete's performance is closely associated with how well they cope with the challenges they face on the way to self-development and performance advancement.

In light of these findings and in realisation of the importance of a physically as well as mentally strong athlete community, FBMA invites athletes and coaches to learn more about establishing effective communication channels between the coach and the trainee, as well as how to best build confidence and trust in their own abilities to ultimately overcome performance stress.

The academy develops its work around 5 central pillars of activity:

- Sports Events & Tournaments: Hosting a number of national and international competitions, tournaments and events.
- Community Engagement: With daily, weekly & monthly activities made accessible to all members of the community, including open and free of charge trainings in a variety of sports.
- Education & Research: Hosting a series of monthly seminars and annual forums, and running a number of research projects and case studies that examine the current landscape of sports in UAE and Abu Dhabi in particular.
- International Conference of Sports for Women (ICSW): Creating a global platform through a biennial international conference to advance discussions on the status of women sports in the UAE and worldwide.
- Local Talent Management: Nurturing local talent and potential to create a platform of professional athletes and role models.

F) FAIR PLAY PROMOTION

Fair Play Promotion is a topic addressed widely in Abu Dhabi across all federations and clubs. For example the ADIB Fair Play table is designed to promote positive behaviour on the pitch, with Fair Play being essential to the enjoyment and development of football. Fair play is essential to our sport and to everyone involved in it. We are happy to celebrate and expand this initiative along with other UAE FA programs," declared Mohammed Khalfan Al Rumaithi, President of the UAE FA. "We need to cherish and nurture the values of sporting spirit and work tirelessly to keep up the momentum. We are appealing to all football fans in UAE to help us celebrate the FIFA Fair Play Days," added Mohammed Khalfan Al Rumaithi.

G) ADDITIONAL MEASURES FOR HEALTH AND INTEGRATION PROMOTION

Health and integration promotion is written in capital letters in Abu Dhabi. For example Abu Dhabi is hosting the 3rd Annual Sports Medicine Conference on 16th November, 2018 at Dusit Thani Hotel, Abu Dhabi.

This year's conference will focus on how the academic researches, clinical practices and innovative industry linked together in the development of the modern Sports Medicine. It will highlight the aid of advanced technology in injury assessments, medical treatments, pain management approaches, rehabilitation and different techniques in prevention of recurring sports injuries resulted from accidents, inadequate training, improper use of protective devices, or insufficient warm-up exercises. The program emphasizes a strong scientific and clinical content with great interests for the sports physician, surgeons, physiotherapist, sports science specialists, coaches, trainers and various professionals in the field of sports medicine, exercise science and rehabilitation of the amateur or professional athlete.



A) MEMBERSHIP IN SPORTS CLUBS AND ASSOCIATIONS

ADSC established clubs around the City of Abu Dhabi. Those clubs work hand by hand with ADSC to enhance that sport is well preformed at the city clubs. The player registered in those governmental clubs are scouted through so many channels such as school festivals and tournaments. The club scouters look for talented players from all ages, to fulfill all the age categories teams that starts from U7 up to the 1st teams. Players in such clubs do not pay if they want to participate in any government club. However, those clubs are not the only way to practice sport in town, Gyms and private clubs have their own athletes and customers too. The difference is that those gyms and private clubs are more specific on the type of sport the athlete wants to join for, in the other hand the price of joining such clubs depends on the period they want to active their memberships for.

B) ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

ADSC vision is stated as "Abu Dhabi: an international capital for sport practicing, competitiveness & international events."

Where the Mission is stated "To have an environment that contributes to enhancing importance of sport practicing and sport programs for all segments of the community, and to implement best and latest international systems to promote competing at local, regional and international levels." Therefore, our exact core business at ADSC is to support the clubs that represents the city of Abu Dhabi, financially and technically to promote the best practices and services from all over the world.



C) SPORT PROMOTING MEASURES

- ADSC promote special care programme to the athletes that are registered
 as players at Abu Dhabi clubs. The programme is mainly about providing the
 best care and appreciation to the players who invest their time working to
 achieve to Abu Dhabi's vision and mission. The programme secures the players future by guaranteeing them a job, plus general workshops; leaderships,
 computers and other specific topics that would give them the experience
 needed for their future plans. furthermore, this programme gives the players an opportunity to give back to the society as it gives them a number of
 social events they have to participate at.
- talent care programme: every club has its own programme related to the talents care, we as ADSC are responsible to evaluate it and develop it.
- one of the programmes also is sending the most talented players from each club to exchange experience and best practices with other clubs in different countries such as Japan, Socotra island and Spain (LaLiga).

- To coordinate with youth and sports associations and agencies to develop future programs for preparation, qualification, and polishing of leaders.





- To develop scientific and technical programs, select lecturers, and fix the dates of courses.
- To regulate and supervise the courses and studies on the preparation and qualification of youth and sports leaders.
- To issue the leadership preparation magazines and circulars.
- To participate in specialized courses, committees and meetings in this field inside and outside the UAE.
- To coordinate with peer Arab, GCC, and international organizations in respect to scientific and technical curricula and programs for approval of the certificates granted by such agencies.

- Festivals oriented to families, children, youth and elderly people.

D) VOLUNTARY PARTICIPATION PROMOTION

The third edition of the National Sports Day was held on March 7th, 2018 in collaboration with the sports organisations and councils across the nation.

The event showcased the 9th Special Olympics MENA Games Abu Dhabi 2018 for the People of Determination (14-22 March 2018). It attracted 1200 athletes from 33 countries and was the biggest preparation event for the Special Olympics World Summer Games 2019.

Inspired by the directions of HH Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice-President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai the Sports Day was held to bring together all resident communities of the UAE. It bears strong reference to the attention of the UAE to embed the values of love between community members, especially as the sport is selected as a means of realising this vision and diffusing the spirit of cooperation and understanding between various age groups and organisations, let alone protecting the health of community members from contemporary diseases.

B) COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGIES

In recent years, the United Arab Emirates has emerged as one of the fastest growing economies in the Middle East & North Africa region, having made significant progress in the Global Competitiveness Index (GCI) and, most notably, within the Information and Communication Technology (ICT) sector. It is certainly no exaggeration to state that the increase in ICT spending in the United Arab Emirates, particularly in recent years, has been nothing short of astronomical. The investments within the country for the overall ICT hardware, software and ICT services during the actual year will reach a double-digit growth.

Data centre facilities and enterprise resource planning systems – a business management software for storing and managing the company's data – as well as managed services such as cloud computing and real-time analytics for different business sectors will be the main drivers of this impressive and efficient increase.

As a result, the country has built up and is constantly developing to emerge as one of most modern Information Technology and telecommunication infrastructures worldwide, providing essential benefits for the businesses, public and private sectors.

Excellent telecommunications network

One of Abu Dhabi's main strengths in the ICT landscape is its mobile and fibre network coverage, which enables a wide range of high-speed ICT services and applications for private end users as well as businesses. The leading network providers and telecommunication companies in the UAE are Etisalat and Du.

Etisalat is one of the largest telecommunications companies in the Middle East, operating in 18 countries and serving over 160 million subscribers. Moreover, it has become one of the world's fastest growing telecom groups, rapidly expanding across Asia and Africa. The carriers provide resilient networks, with nationwide fixed lines and wireless technology. Presently, their mobile infrastructure, which operates with the highest speed mobile broadband connectivity in the Middle East, covers the whole country area with 2G and 3G networks, as well as almost all relevant regions with 4G (LTE) networks.



A modern internet society

The United Arab Emirates is ranked the third biggest online market with the highest internet penetration rate in the Middle East. Internet access and usage will continue to grow at a rapid pace, making it the fastest growing region worldwide.

Nearly three out of four people in the United Arab Emirates own a smartphone, making it the country with the highest smartphone penetration in the world. In the coming years, the UAE anticipates a large impact on internet consumption due to a constant increase in the usage of internet services with mobile devices such as smartphones and tablets.

The extent and quality of the country's network infrastructure, both now and in the future, will fully support the usage of a wide range of broadband mobile applications and services. Besides the affinity of the UAE's population to video consumption, social media and information services over the internet, e-commerce is becoming one of the strongest pillars of its internet industry. The UAE is the Middle East's largest e-commerce market and in terms of online retail sales per capita is now on a par with the United States and Sweden.

Government and ICT business sector

The United Arab Emirates government possesses an intelligent vision to develop Information and Communication Technology as one of the key industries to diversify the local economy, which is reflected in the high levels of ICT uptake. Furthermore, the government has proclaimed a federal 'UAE Vision 2021', which aims to elevate the country to become one of the best ICT nations in the world.

The current UAE government strategy intends to create even more convenience for its citizens by constantly developing an accountable and innovative government. One of the strategies introduced is an 'eGovernment' system that facilitates government operations and the distribution of governmental information and services while offering an increased portfolio of public services to citizens in an efficient and cost-effective manner.

Supporting future technologies for the Abu Dhabi World Capital of Sport 2019 and beyond

The technological improvements within the country's ICT environment in the coming years will have a profound effect not only on the UAE's local residents, but also on the organisation and execution of the country's Global Sport City positioning based on the hosting concepts of many globally established events but in particular of two of the most prestigious mega events the AFC Asian Cup 2019 and the Special Olympics 2019. The UAE already has one of the most advanced ICT infrastructures in the region, a strong basis on which to develop ICT services at all AFC Asian Cup 2019 locations and focus on enhancing the event and fan experience for all stakeholders in the competition.

The ICT network implemented in the United Arab Emirates enables portable devices such as smartphones and tablets to become a central medium for all means of IT-based marketing and organisation services and applications.

4G advanced or 'LTE-A' technology will enable multicast linear video streaming via the mobile network, paving the way for fluent video services. This technology will be complemented by dedicated local Wi-Fi networks in popular areas such as stadia. Advanced network infrastructure may also allow mobile devices to be used as second screens, receiving extra broadband content and enhancing stadium experiences.

All forms of mobile applications related to the global, national and regional events such as comprehensive information services, gaming, video portals, social platforms, e-commerce and m-commerce, payment procedures, digital ticketing and venue access services will be fully supported by the UAE's ICT infrastructure. This will optimise the tournament's organisation and increase the entertainment factor, fan experience and overall customer satisfaction during the tournament.

In the future, Abu Dhabi's network infrastructure will support new technologies such as Google Glass, a wearable computer that utilises OHMD (optical head-mounted display). Interconnected wearable devices such as these are expected to become the norm in 2019 and will help shorten the distance between users and technology, enabling comprehensive video integration, networked information and augmented reality services to connect the physical and virtual worlds.

The United Arab Emirates will also continuously monitor other emerging trends, such as smart watches and the impact they have on consumer behaviour. The UAE is committed to encompassing an element of flexibility in its local ICT infrastructure to cater to these emerging demands.

Location-based services could be revolutionised by Wi-Fi and beacon technologies, which are currently not yet widespread at sports venues and other public places. Different forms of information could be precisely directed to target groups by sending out a notification with certain content or trigger an online application.

News, offers and payment actions will be addressed to individual target groups, providing a high level of service and customer convenience. Such services could provide additional and precise information for stadium visitors such as transport points, food and beverage locations, ticket information or contacts of official facilities during all events in the near future.



Mobile booking and payment methods will become standard because of their ability to facilitate and speed up sales processes by utilising smartphones. In return, this may eliminate the need for fans to pay for food, drinks or merchandise with cash or credit cards, instead using payment apps to pay via barcode, Bluetooth or near field communication technology.

Sophisticated mobile payment services in conjunction with location-based services could also encompass advanced ordering functions to provide special groups with extra opportunities to request food directly from the comfort of their seats.

Green vision for ICT

The network design in the United Arab Emirates will include state-of-the-art technologies for a sustainable, flexible and scalable growth. This vision includes energy management and green network design, a service already offered by the country's leading ITC company, Etisalat. By reducing energy needs and providing greater efficiencies, the UAE will strive to explore ICT avenues to reduce energy use. New, intelligent tools are able to better control how energy is distributed and used, harnessing the power of smart-metering systems, smart-grid technologies, smart building technologies, the latest machine-to-machine (M2M) solutions and automated energy management.

All above mentioned means and facilities will be best used to showcase Abu Dhabi's position being Global City of Sports. The organisation systems around any of the events held, the general promotion and information, everything and anything contributing to the organisation, information, promotion and marketing of sports will be at the highest professional standard according to technology matters.





RELATIONS BETWEEN THE CITY COUNCIL AND SPORTS OR POLITICAL INSTITUTIONS AT LOCAL, REGIONAL AND NATIONAL LEVEL

A) RELATIONS BETWEEN THE CITY AND THE LOCAL AND REGIONAL AND NATIONAL SPORTS ORGANISATIONS

Since the United Arab Emirates was established and up till now, the UAE visionary Leadership gave its utmost attention to the sports sector, sparing no effort to care for, develop, and give it the corporate mark due to this sector's immense importance in the country's March and development.

In 1971, the Ministry of Sports was established, after that there were several changes and finally it was transformed in 2017 when the Youth Sector was separated from the General Authority of Youth and Sports Welfare and then emerged the General Authority for Sports with HE Mohammad Khalfan Al Rumaithi holding the post of President up to date.

General Authority for Sports is the higher government authority empowered to look after the UAE sports sector as per the Decree-Law No. (7) of 2008 regarding the Authority and its affiliates.

General Authority for Sports plays a leading role in providing an appropriate environment that enables sportspeople to hone their physical capabilities, enhance all aspects of competitiveness and recreation, and seek to promote the results of the national teams at all levels.



RELATIONS BETWEEN THE CITY COUNCIL AND SPORTS OR POLITICAL INSTITUTIONS AT LOCAL, REGIONAL AND NATIONAL LEVEL

The Authority shapes the general policy of the UAE sports sector, sets plans and programmes to achieve the desired objectives, as well as supporting, overseeing and coordinating the affairs of its affiliates. Further, it issues decisions pertaining the registration, merge, suspension or cancellation of the activities of its affiliates, as well as approving structures and financial, administrative and organizational regulations of the registered bodies.

The responsibilities are to

- Enforce the Government's Policy related to the sports sector (competition, recreation, and heritage) and develop plans and projects to implement them.
- Disseminate sports culture among all segments of society and make it a style of life to society individuals.
- Achieve outstanding sports results that help promote the UAE position in all fields at regional, continental and international levels.
- Take care of the handicapped and women, and take all appropriate measures and actions to ensure getting them involved in sports activities.

Summarizing the above the General Authority of Sports is the main coordinator in the UAE cooperating tightly with the Abu Dhabi Sports Council in Abu Dhabi to ensure best coordination and cooperation between the City of Abu Dhabi and the UAE on all levels.

B) PROMOTION OF AGREEMENTS WITH SPORTING GOODS INDUSTRY, SPORTS FEDERATIONS OR OTHER ENTITIES FOR THE PROMOTION OF SPORT

The General Authority For Sports is accustomed to appreciating athletic achievements, as it is well into its seventh year of highlighting UAE athletes and partners in athletic achievements.





RELATIONS BETWEEN THE CITY COUNCIL AND SPORTS OR POLITICAL INSTITUTIONS AT LOCAL, REGIONAL AND NATIONAL LEVEL

With the Sport Achievement award Abu Dhabi celebrates those achievers in the sports sector as pioneers which hoist the UAE flag over local, Arab, and international skies; bequeathing the UAE with a respected status and favour throughout the world, and also reflecting their loyalty to the nation.

This appreciation ceremony is held under the patronage of H.H. Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed Al Nahyan, President of the UAE, and the patronage of Sheikh Zayed Bin Mansour Al Nahyan, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Presidential Affairs.

The ceremony is organized by the General Authority For Sports for those accomplishing athletic achievements or those contributing to or leaving a mark on the sports sector be it an industry, a federation or another entity promoting sport.

The award is based on an academic, realistic, and objective approach to award selection according to a regulation that stipulates special standards of selection for the second session.

B) INVESTMENTS IN LOCAL SPORT RELATED ECONOMY AND RESEARCH AND INNOVATION

The UAE approximately AED 25 billion per year for health, education and social development — a high percentage of these AED 25 billion goes into sport promotion, research and innovation.

Many of the conferences, events and the measures in the sports for all sector as well as the competitive sector are realized in cooperation with sports organizations and institutions on a National and International level.





A) MANIFESTO OF ACES

UAE schools channel sporting values

The inclusion of sports on a larger scale into the school calendar is a terrific way for children to imbibe life skills, say parents and teachers.

There are myriad reasons why sports should be an integral part of a school's culture and ethos, starting with learning all-important life skills. Schools need to get results, but the reality is GCSEs and A-levels are simply a measure of a student's ability to remember.

"Put a child in a classroom and give them lesson after lesson in maths, English, science and so on, and they'll hardly learn a thing. Put them on a sports field and run them ragged, and they won't learn a thing. Mix it up, give them variation, and they'll learn much more." Mike Wilson, Incoming Head, Cranleigh Abu Dhabi.

Such life skills include operating as part of a team, problem-solving, thinking outside the box, learning to deal with pressure, getting out of a sticky situation and coming out on top.

Sport should be an integral element of a child's physical and developmental education. A big part of the UAE sporting philosophy is pride, enjoyment, respect and sportsmanship, These are character traits our children will take with them into secondary school and throughout their whole career.

This concept extends beyond school to events and activities that involve other establishments, including both local and international tournaments and events.



The opportunities to socialize with children from other schools and cultures are a big positive of sport this gives our children the opportunity to compete against and meet children from all across the region.

These programs are underlining the importance of the health benefits of regular exercise in children. It's massively important to encourage sports from a health perspective and to educate a life with fair play.

B) SOCIAL ADVANTAGES OF A WORLD CAPITAL OF SPORT

Higher Education Sports Federation was established in 2000 in the Emirate of Abu Dhabi and declared by the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research under Decree No. 66 of 1999 issued by the Ministry of Education and youth.

The objectives of the Federation

- Dissemination of cultural and social education and sports among its members and to create ways and means to exploit their leisure time to return them benefit.
- Closer links between members of the Federation each other and closer relations between cultural institutions and social and sports in the country and participate in events and competitions organized by the hardware-based.
- Assist federations and bodies to publish official sports and work to promote
 the cultural and social aspect and sports for members of the Federation and
 the expanding membership base and attract youth elements and provide
 the necessary services for their formative valid configuration.
- Work to serve the community and the environment, including that will benefit the citizens.



- Seek to raise the level of sports for sports teams and support the various sports federations to represent the State regional, continental and international levels.
- Higher Education Sports Federation is the official organization dealing with sporting activities for all institutions affiliated to the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research in the United Arab Emirates.

Higher Education Sports Federation seeks to contribute to the process of continuous development in the field of fitness and physical education at all levels of the United Arab Emirates through effective partnership and cooperation with the ministries, sports federations and clubs, and other relevant institutions in the state.

The Federation works to achieve its mission through the activation of sports and cultural activities and social as well as attention to scientific research and scientific activities, community services and the development of sports programs in the state.

In close partnership with YSA it aims to play a leading role in providing a positive attractive environment that enables youth to develop physical and mental abilities, utilize free time, improve creative skills, deepen national identity principles, instil loyalty, belonging and voluntary work sense.

YSA works also on developing competitive, recreational and traditional sports, providing a healthy environment to carry them out and making it possible to upgrade results at national and international levels (see Chapter 1).

Its role includes implementing the Government's policy on the sports sector, spreading the culture of sports as a way of life to reduce illnesses and promote fitness, representing the best talent at regional and international sports events and taking tangible measures to facilitate the participation of women and people with special needs in sports events.



C) INITIATIVES AND ACTIVITIES TO SUPPORT ACES EUROPE

Participation in competitions open for all residents

In April 2018, the UAE Government approved a federal law which allows all UAE residents, regardless of their nationalities, to participate in national sports competitions held in the country. The law applies to children of Emirati mothers, UAE passport holders and all those born in the UAE along with residents of all nationalities.

The move aims to promote sports in the UAE and widen the base of talented participants in various sports. It also seeks to instill the value of loyalty to UAE and the government agenda of integrating all segments of society in a peaceful co-existence.

A) EVENTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE CANDIDACY AND THE TITLE AS A WORLD CAPITAL OF SPORT

During the candidacy Abu Dhabi will refer to the bid at all events listed in Chapter 4c. The same will apply in case Abu Dhabi will hold the title World Capital of Sport 2019.

Abu Dhabi will support ACES in promoting sport among all the citizens, particularly disadvantaged groups, children, the elderly and the disabled, among others.

The support will also include ACES goal to encourage private and public initiatives in order to increase support for sport, not only from a professional point of view, but also as a channel for social cohesion and to improve the health and quality of life of citizens.

All events listed in Chapter 4c are used to promote and enhance ACES main objectives for cities that are candidates for or that have been awarded the World Capital of Sport as they are:

- 1. Enjoyment in exercise.
- 2. Willingness to achieve.
- 3. Sense of community.
- 4. Learning fair play.
- 5. Improvement of health.

Any connection made with the candidacy at the events listed in Chapter 4c will be made in a way to create a wide awareness for ACES goal in these respects.
